School Improvement Priorities

1. To ensure that challenging targets continue to allow children to make good or better progress, focussing on Year 2 and Year 5 classes where assessment data has shown more targeted support is needed .
2. To ensure a broad and balanced curriculum with a clear emphasis on progression of skills and knowledge, with a detailed scheme of work for subjects.
3. To continue our review, update and evaluation of the teaching of reading within school so that reading scores are at least in line with the national average. Develop and write a robust phonics programme tailored to our children and school.
4. To create and implement an effective, efficient and manageable assessment system to address the new early learning goals in EYFS, to ensure that children make a good start to their learning journey.
