
Oak Class were visited by Iain Hook, who talked to them about the different career opportunities open

Rowan—Phonics Screening—wb 12th June

Willow—KS1 SATs—any time in May

Maple - Multiplication Check—1st 3 weeks of June

Oak—KS2 SATs—9th-12th May
