

Things to practise at home:

Reading:

Read with an adult every day. Please sign the diary every day and make sure that it is in school.

Spelling:

Practise Year 2 spellings as detailed in the middle of the reading diary and set on Spelling Shed every week for homework.

Maths:

Compare and order numbers to 100 and use <, > and = Read and write all numbers to 100 in digits and words. Recognise the place value of any 2-digit number and be able to partition it Count in 2s, 3s and 5s from 0, and in 10s forwards and backwards from any number. Read scales in divisions of 1s, 2s, 5s and 10s. Recall and use multiplication and division facts for 2, 5 and 10. Recall and use the addition and subtraction facts to 20. Add and subtract two 2-digit numbers using an efficient method. Read the time on a clock to the nearest 15 minutes. Use different coins to make the same amount. Recognise, find, name and write 1/3, 1/4, 2/4 and 3/4. Name and describe properties of 2D and 3D shapes.
